July 14th – July 23rd (8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.) and

July 24th – July 25th (8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.)

Non-perishable entries include: Clothing, Knitting, Crochet, Needlework, Quilts, Preserved Foods, Fine Arts, Photography, Spinning, and 4-H exhibits.

LEGOS AND HOBBIES & CRAFTS entries will be accepted only on:

July 30th (3:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.) at Mesa Public Library (3rd Floor)

Entries must be pre-registered by July 25th.

PERISHABLE entries will be accepted on:

July 30th (3:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.) at Mesa Public Library (3rd floor)

Entries must be pre-registered by July 25th.

Indoor Exhibits - General Rules

1. Entries are open to anyone who live, work, go to school in Los Alamos County, or are enrolled in Los Alamos County 4-H or Rio Arriba County 4-H. Rio Arriba 4-H members can only compete in open divisions.
2. All entries must be created in the current year (since August 2024). All youth entries must be the entire work of the youth.
3. Exhibitors may enter only one item per class in open and 4-H divisions.
4. All entries are considered complete as entered and will be judged as finished items. The right is reserved to reject any entry deemed unsuitable for exhibit. Entries must be made in the name of the person who did the work.
5. Exhibits will be judged according to 3 age categories: Youth (5-10 yrs.), Intermediate (11-15 yrs.), and Adult (16 yrs. and older).
6. Professionals or other individuals are invited to enter items for "EXHIBIT ONLY," but their entries will not be eligible for competition. No advertising is allowed.
7. Each entry will be classified and tagged according to specifications outlined in the entry book.

9. Incorrectly classified entries shall be placed in the proper category by superintendents.
10. Unlisted classes may be added or subdivided, as needed.
11. Articles made from purchased kits or prepared mixes should be listed as such and will be judged in a separate class from original entries.



Indoor Exhibits - General Rules cont.

12. Garments that have been worn or items that have been used will be accepted but must be CLEAN and well pressed.
13. All Indoor Exhibits will be displayed on the 3rd floor of Mesa Public Library at 2400 Central Ave.
14. First, second, and third place awards may be given in each open division class and 4-H division class.
15. Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion awards may be given in each division for exhibits deemed outstanding.
16. "Best of the Best" Award will be presented to the top exhibit in the following 6 departments: Creative Arts (includes Fine Arts and Hobbies & Crafts); Culinary Arts (includes Baking and Preserved Foods); Fiber Arts (includes Clothing, Crochet, Knitting, Needlework, Spinning); Horticulture (includes Flowers, Fruits, and Vegetables), Photography, and Quilts.
17. The Los Alamos County Fair will take precautions to prevent loss or damage to exhibits but is not responsible for articles entered. Staff and volunteers will be on duty during scheduled viewing hours. However, articles of exceptional value or that are one of a kind should not be entered.
18. ALL non-perishable exhibits must be picked up on Saturday, August 2, between 3:00 PM and 4:00 PM. No article will be released before that time. ARTICLES NOT CLAIMED BY THEN WILL BE CONSIDERED RELINQUISHED. The Fair Committee, Fair Staff, or the County will not be held responsible for loss or damage of entered items or for unclaimed articles. Baked goods, flowers, fruits and vegetables will not be returned.

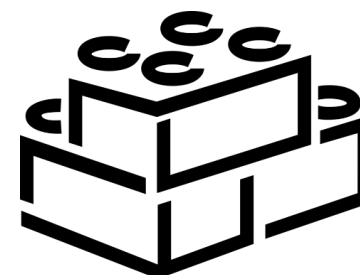

3. A collection consists of items that have been purchased or received as a gift.
4. Items made by the exhibitor are NOT considered collectibles in this department.

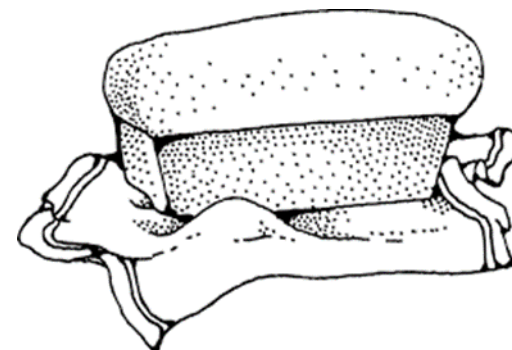

GENERAL RULES FOR EXHIBITS

- Entries should include the exact number of specimens called for in this schedule.
- An exhibitor may enter as many classes as desired. All classes may be subdivided by kind, variety, and/or color.
- Exhibits should be free of insects, disease, spray residue and soil. Length of stems should be in proportion to the size of the bloom.
- If possible, all specimens should be correctly labeled with name/variety.
- Containers for horticulture specimens will be provided, except for the Vegetable Basket.
- All horticulture exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor.

DIVISION 9: FRUITS

Fruits are displayed on a plate with the number of specimens designated by the schedule. All fruits should be heavy to show juice content. They should be uniform in size, shape and color, and free from insect damage. They should be ripe, except pears and apples, which are picked before they ripen. They should be shown with natural bloom (the waxy substance that covers fruit to keep it from drying out).

Vegetables should be in proper stage of development - crisp, tender, and fresh. They should be uniform and average in size, color, and shape. They should have no blemishes, cracks, insect damage, dust, or spray residue.
